



(SSDS) Incident Types

Any incident that meets the Incident Type Definitions for one of the SSDS incident types must be reported through the SSDS system, regardless of whether any disciplinary action was taken. The incident types are as follows:

- Arson Assault Computer Trespass Damage to Property
- False Public Alarm Fight HIB Alleged HIB Confirmed
- Kidnapping Robbery/Extortion Sexual Assault Sexual Contact
- Substance Offense Theft •Threat Criminal Threat Simple
- Trespass Weapon Offense Other Incident Leading to Removal



ANNUAL K-12 SITE ASSESSMENT

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:41–14, New Jersey school districts and nonpublic schools are required to assess the security features and vulnerabilities of school buildings and grounds on an annual basis, utilizing a checklist provided by the New Jersey Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness (NJOHSP), in collaboration with the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE).

The NJDOE and NJOHSP have identified the SITE ASSESS tool as the requisite tool to fulfill the assessment and reporting requirement




